

t has been a jam-packed year - capped by the opportunity to deliver more than \$167,000 to our five Interest Areas in May! This brings IWCF's total investment in our broader community to more than \$2.56 million...a rewarding illustration of the power of collective giving.

We've taken a hard look at our future, as well, following the oft-proven adage that those who don't grow, stagnate. This led us to move on two fronts: our strategic plan and our pooled-fund grants program.

Our board engaged several members in a lengthy process to update our strategic plan. Strategic planning resulted in three key focus areas:

- evolving our grants process to enhance impact, including better understanding of community needs and collaboration;
- evolution of our operational structure to carry us into the future without increasing volunteer workload; and
- advancing membership recruitment and engagement for our current members, while addressing a changing population.

We're about to embark on the first step of this plan-looking at whether and how we may want to modify our pooled-fund grants. Following several discussion-group meetings this summer, our interests seemed to coalesce around trying a one-year pilot program with a higher minimum grant available over one to three years. At the end of the pilot, we'll do an assessment to decide what we and our grantees liked, what we'd change, and whether to try a modified version for another year or go back to the prior model.

During these discussions, several exciting ideas surfaced for how we might want to invest funds over and above our five grants. It will be interesting to see where consensus takes us during the upcoming year.

This is all part of our mutual work to remain a relevant and positive force in southwestern Idaho philanthropy. The sincere interest everyone has shown in what IWCF does will ensure that IWCF will continue to be a growing, dynamic organization responsive to the changing environment and to the community it serves.

WCF annually accepts and researches grant proposals from nonprofits, then evaluates them under our funding criteria. To determine the allocation of their annual pooled-fund grants, members vote on the projects proposed in five interest areas: cultural arts, education, environment, financial stability and health.

In 2014, the grants committee of 54 members narrowed the many applicants to 12 ballot possibilities. Eight projects (one each in all five interest areas plus three additional projects) received enough member votes to receive grants.

At our annual meeting in May, IWCF awarded a total of \$167,215 in grants for these projects:

Year In Review

n Fiscal Year 2014, the Idaho Women's Charitable Foundation received a total of \$320,025 in member contributions for pooled-fund grants and individual designations, a significant statement of generosity from our members and acknowledgement of the importance they place on personal giving.

A record total \$336,633.50 was distributed to community agencies through a combination of Individual Grant Designations and Pooled-Fund Grants. Additionally, the membership voted to fund a record \$167,216 to eight agencies for the 2014-15 Pooled-Fund Grants. The Susan Smith IWCF Endowment Fund ended the fiscal year at \$456,880, an increase of \$81,485 over the year earlier balance. Of this increase, \$9,500 came from new contributions and \$71,985 from earnings which represents more than a 19% return. The Endowment invests 70% in broadly-diversified indexed stock funds, 27% in fixed income funds and 3% in cash.

Member contributions to operations and event ticket sales continued to fully fund office staff and operations as well as educational and social functions with an excess \$746 income over expenses. Unrestricted Reserves, including Board-designated funds, totaled \$59,482 at year end. This built-up Unrestricted Reserve plus annual earnings from the Endowment secure the sustainability and future vitality of IWCF as an important voice for philanthropy and community involvement well into the future.



A Year of Education

he IWCF Education Committee increases awareness and understanding of the community's needs and assets through programs presented for our members, guests and the community. We plan and conduct panel discussions, forums and present experts on a variety of topics related to our five grant interest areas. During this program year, we focused on health and the environment. To demonstrate our commitment to the environment, three of our five programs were located in LEED certified buildings.

Highlights for the 2013-2014 program year:

A joint presentation with the St. Luke's Women's Forum, "Childhood Obesity: The Number One Health Risk to Children." Guest speakers included Greg Janos, St. Luke's Children's Hospital medical director, Stacy Beeson, nutritionist, pediatrician Mindy Gaddis, and Jim Everett, CEO, Treasure Valley YMCA.

We invited our members and the nonprofit community to learn about our own grant making process. IWCF members Anne Hay, co-chair of the Grants Committee, and Ann Sandven, Terry Reilly Health Services, presented "Grant Making Process and Best Practices for Non-profits."

"The 4 R's: Recycle, Reuse, Reduce the Carbon Footprint and Re-Purpose Buildings" at the Boise Watershed Environmental Education

Center. Catherine Chertudi, Boise Public Works Solid Waste Program manager; Charlie Woodruff, Executive Director of the Idaho Chapter of the US Green Building Council; and Ben Jarvis, Pollution Prevention Projects manager presented how to be better stewards of our environment in the Treasure Valley.
