A Message from the Board

ducated philanthropy is WORKING in our communities, thanks to you and your Idaho Women's Charitable Foundation. In partnership with our grantees, we are transforming lives. In May of 2016, we awarded 5 grants totalling \$150,000, bringing our collective philanthropic investment to nearly \$3.2 million since 2002. We truly appreciate you and all that you share.

Last year, our members voted to explore a new granting scenario: meeting the immediate needs of very-low- and extremely-low-income citizens in Ada County. Our \$40,000 pilot Above and Beyond Collaboration (ABC) Grant will be awarded in October 2016--our largest single investment to date!

Our own endowment is substantial and growing. This year, to avoid increasing annual membership dues, we will begin using part of its earnings to fund our operations, education programs, membership, office space and salaries for our part-time administrative staff.

Because IWCF invests in projects serving a broad spectrum of Idahoans, your Board is focusing on increasing member diversity. To boost our understanding of grantees' needs and widen our sphere of influence, we need a variety of voices at our IWCF table.

We budgeted \$15,000 for a website makeover, updated logo and short video to promote our work in the community, improve internal communications with members, and introduce our philosophy of educated philanthropy to potential new members.

We challenge you to enrich your own personal IWCF experience by:

- --Thinking about placing your Individual Grant Designation (IGD) in the Susan Smith Endowment Fund.

Pooled Giving for a greater impact

WCF annually accepts and researches grant proposals from nonprofits, then evaluates them under our funding criteria. To determine the allocation of their annual pooled-fund grants, members vote on the projects proposed in five interest areas: cultural arts, education, environment, financial stability and health.

In 2015-16, the grants committee of 42 members narrowed the many applicants to 10 ballot possibilities. Five projects (one each in our five interest areas) received enough member votes to receive grants.

At our annual meeting in May, IWCF awarded a total of \$150,000 in grants for these projects:

Treasure Valley Food Coalition Boise Farmers Market Mobile Unit \$30,000 (1 year)

Our food system has an enormous impact on the environment. Local farmers using sustainable farming practices can help mitigate environmental degradation, but only if they have markets for their produce. Many consumers, especially those of low income. find it difficult to access these foods. This request funds the purchase and retrofit of a shuttle bus to create a mobile farmers market, similar to a bookmobile. providing access to more Ada County residents.



Children's Free Dental Clinic

Mobile Clinic Upgrades and Additions \$30,000 (over 2 years)

Miles of Smiles has operated nearly nine years in the Treasure Valley. IWCF grant monies will purchase additional handpieces and instruments

to ensure quality dental care to children in need; dental supplies to treat 4,000 students with exams, teeth cleanings, fluoride varnish, X-rays, extractions and restorations; an in-house water distiller; electrical hook-ups installed



in additional schools to expand the program to reach more children; insurance premiums for 2016-2017; and an overhead covering to protect the RV in storage.

Idaho Diaper Bank

Diaper Need: A Hidden Consequence of Poverty \$30,000 (1 year)

The IDB helps ensure children can meet their potential. Providing something as simple as diapers gives families in poverty a glimpse of hope. It allows them to keep their babies healthy and helps prevent maternal depression; allows limited resources to go toward other basic needs like food and rent; and means babies can go to daycare so their parents can go to work. This grant will launch an innovative, virtual warehousing model and an online fundraising platform to promote sustainability.

Salvation Army

Equip Preschool at School for Teen Moms \$30,000 (1 year)

Children of immature parents frequently live in poverty and often don't perform as well as children of older mothers on measures of child development and school readiness. The IWCF grant will equip and furnish new preschool classrooms and a playground for the children of student teen mothers attending the Booth-Marian Pritchett School (BMPS). Adding early-learning education to the on-campus child care services will benefit the children as their mothers complete high school.



West Central Highlands Resource Conservation and Development **Sweet Syringa Hall**

\$30,000 (1 year)

This 1897 building, owned by Syringa Club since 1991, is in desperate need of structural repairs. Following a severe wind event, roof joists were patched, but roof connection to walls for stabilization during seismic and wind forces is needed. The IWCF grant will fund new joists to tie the roof to the walls, resulting in a new roof.

Year In Review

daho Women's Charitable Foundation received a record \$328,000 in member contributions for Pooled-Fund Grants and Individual Grant Designations during Fiscal Year 2015. This figure reflects both our membership's ongoing generosity and their continued belief in the importance of personal giving.

IWCF members voted to grant \$163,500 to six agencies from Pooled Funds in the spring of 2015. In response to feedback from the local grantee community, these grants will be disbursed over two- and three-year periods, rather than over one year as in the past. In addition to Pooled-Fund Grants, IWCF distributed \$168,750 to community agencies through Individual Grant Designations during fiscal year 2015.

Our members also decided they would like to initiate a pilot grant to address critical needs of our very-low and extremely-low income population, the Above and Beyond Collaboration (ABC) grant. The \$40,000 grant will be awarded at the 2016 Fall Symposium.

The Susan Smith IWCF Endowment Fund ended the fiscal year at \$473,818, an increase of \$16,938 over the prior year's ending balance. Of this increase, \$10,195 came from new contributions and \$6,743 from earnings. The Endowment invests 70% in broadly-diversified indexed stock funds, 27% in fixed income funds and 3% in cash.

Member contributions to operations and event ticket sales continue to fund operating and staff expenses, as well as educational and social functions. Unrestricted Reserves, including Board-designated funds, grew by \$787 during fiscal year 2015 and totaled \$60,269 at year end. This Unrestricted Reserve and the earnings from the Endowment ensure that IWCF will remain a visible, vital force supporting informed philanthropy and community involvement well into the future.



A Year of Education

Fostering educated philanthropy, ensuring informed giving amongst our membership

he IWCF Education Committee increases awareness and understanding of the community's needs and assets through programs presented for our members, guests, and the broader community. In 2015-16, our panel discussions, forums with experts and book discussions focused on the visual arts, community mental health or inspired philanthropy.

September: Insight into Grants

Members, their guests and SW Idaho nonprofits attended two sessions of "Insight into IWCF Grants." In each session, nearly 75 percent of the attendees were from the nonprofit community. Our objective was to improve our outreach by clarifying our process and offering a Q&A. Susan May, IWCF Grants chair, presented an overview of the IWCF

process and important dates. Ann Sandven, IWCF member and grant professional, reviewed best practices for effective grant writing. The keys are to respond to the priorities of the granting organization, follow instructions, and have a colleague read your proposal to gain a fresh perspective.



October: Visual Arts in the Community: Art Institutions and Arts Education in Idaho

At the Boise Art Museum (BAM), we heard from Michael Faison, executive director of the Idaho Commission on the Arts (ICA); Melanie Fales, executive director of the Boise Art Museum; and Amy Nack, art educator and founder of Wingtip Press. ICA supports Idaho arts organizations' participation in arts and education programming, but local governments are the largest public funders of art. Ruth Piispanen, ICA director of Arts Education, described national Core Arts Standards recommended for adoption by Idaho arts educators.

November: Visual Artists in Boise

At the Benjamin Victor Sculpture Gallery and Studio, we heard from sculptor and Professor of Practice Ben Victor and mosaic artist Reham Pierson Aarti. Both shared their artistic journeys, creative processes, education and preparation to be artists, and the challenges and benefits of being a working artist.

January: An Unquiet Mind Book Discussion

Preparing for the Fall Symposium mental health theme, committee member Jeanne

Miranda recommended we read An Unquiet Mind, by Dr. Kay Jamison, co-director of The Johns Hopkins Mood Disorders Clinic. At noon and evening book discussions on Jan. 21, small groups led by facilitators

with mental health expertise were engaged and inspired by Jamison, who had a rich academic life and a successful writing career while managing her own severe depression.

January: Inspired Philanthropy

Laura Simic, BSU vice president for Advancement, and Susan Graham, Certified



Elder Law Attorney, are IWCF members and experts in philanthropy and estate planning. Simic defined philanthropy as a voluntary action for public good and an expression of our values. She posed critical questions to shape a giving plan. Graham reviewed legal and technical aspects of giving plans; identified steps to follow once we decide to make a bequest; and listed strategies to simplify the estate planning process.

February: Critical Issues and Resources in Idaho Mental Health



Dr. Jeanne Miranda, IWCF member and professor, UCLA Department of Psychiatry and Biobehavioral Sciences, described mental health as a concept, how diagnosis and treatment have evolved in the U.S., and the status of mental health care in Idaho,

where it is limited and especially hard to find in rural areas.

March: Youth Mental Health in Idaho

Teresa Alexander, CEO of Warm Springs Counseling Center, welcomed us. This building opened in 1910 as the Children's Home Society of Idaho, which served 6,600 orphaned or abandoned children until transitioning into a counseling center in the 1960s. The Center turns away no one due to financial need. Amy Thompson LSW, Clinic Operations Manager, reviewed children's behavioral health services, noting research completed in 2015 found that 20 percent of Idaho teens seriously considered suicide and 30 percent abused substances.
